Aberfan

On 21st October 1966 a coal slag heap slid down into the valley and onto Pantglas Primary school in Wales. 116 children and 28 adults were killed. It was the last Friday before half term and school was finishing at midday. The disaster wiped out a generation and a community and the mining village of Aberfan became known worldwide.

Today marks the 50th anniversary and as a school, we commemorated those young lives by arranging the children holding hands in concentric circles on the AF playground. It is a small but hopefully poignant reminder of this tragic event and perhaps a reminder to us all, that we should be thankful for everything we have. We are all a part of the community of St John's Green and should appreciate and value our community and the strengths from its diversity.


