School Uniform

Boys

Grey or black trousers.

Grey or black shorts (these must not be sports shorts)

White collared shirt or white polo shirt

Navy fleece, sweatshirt or jumper Black shoes or black trainers. Navy, brown or black close-toed sandals.

<u>Girls</u>

Grey or black trousers or skirt.

Grey or black shorts (these must not be sports/cycling shorts).

White collared shirt or white polo shirt

Navy fleece, sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan

Blue pique summer dress.

Grey pinafore.

Sensible flat black shoes or black trainers. Navy, brown or black closed-toed sandals.

PE Kit

Coloured Polo shirt, (available from the school uniform suppliers), linked to the Team that children are allocated to.

Navy blue or black shorts. (A small motif is permissible)

Children must have trainers for P.E. and these must be a change of trainers should your child wear black trainers for school.

Tracksuit - either blue or black.

On PE days children should wear their PE kit to school.

Swimming Kit

Boys-Swimming Trunks. (NOT Bermuda type shorts/baggy shorts) TRUNKS please. These are swimming lessons, not a day at the beach.

Girls-One piece swimming costume.

Children with long hair (boys/girls) will need to wear a swimming hat.

Claudius, who with 96.8% attendance had the best attendance for the whole academic year.








