Personnel, Premises & Finance (PPF)

The PPF committee of the FGB met on Monday afternoon. Alan Short, the Chair of the Governing Body, has provided a summary below of some of the things discussed at the meeting.

The Personnel, Premises and Finance (PPF) Sub Committee of the School Governors had its second of 6 regular meetings of the school year on Tuesday 1 December 2015. The clue is in the title and the committee receives and discusses monthly reports on school finances as well as reports on the Catering and Breakfast Club accounts and related matters together with Personnel and resources issues and development of the school buildings and outside areas.

In reviewing the Catering part of the report, the committee noted the take up of the free meal provision of EYFS and KS1 which is below the expectation from the government finance support package. It was decided to remind parents and carers of the free school meal provision and hope that more will take advantage of these free meals which use the government nutrition standards. However, it was important to note the excellent job the catering staff of St John's Green do and note that the % uptake for our school is one of the highest in Colchester.

As the price of the paid for meals had not increased for some time and was now significantly below the prices in other local schools, the committee agreed to review these prices in March 2016. The committee also agreed to review the charges for letting out the school premises and car parks for external use outside of the school day. Some of these charges have again not been increased recently. Furthermore, they considered that perhaps a wider review of the potential to rent out the school facilities on a wider proactive basis as a way of increasing the funding of the school.

In terms of forward budget planning, all schools were reported to be struggling to balance budgets as a result of the unavoidable increase in pension and National Insurance contributions to be introduced in the next year. These increases were not matched by increases in government funding. A key issue for the school is the expansion programme, up to a total of 630 pupils, and the extent of recruitment of teaching and support staff as the expansion rolls forward. A separate meeting is to take place between the Chair of the PPF, the Chair of Governors and the Head to consider this staff programme so that a revised three-year budget plan can be produced for further consideration at the next meeting in early next term and the establishment in March of the 2016/17 budget.

The committee received a report of the recent recruitment of support staff and the process for the replacement of staff.

There were currently no premises issues requiring the decisions of the committee.

The PPF is also responsible for creating and reviewing school policies and procedures within the areas of its remit. Many of these are based on model policies issued by Essex County Council. At the December meeting the following were approved: Financial Regulation, Lettings Policy, Data Protection policy, Guidelines on the Senior Business Manger's role and Discipline and Dismissal Procedure. A draft of the Major and Critical Incident Plan had been circulated for comment and this would be supported by a draft Continuation of Business Plan to be considered at the next meeting.
