Flu Immunisations

All parents should have received an e-mail from the school on Monday about Flu Immunisations.

Within that e-mail was an e-mail link to book your child's 'Flu' Immunisation.

The deadline for the consent form is Monday 2nd October. If parents cannot use the link or didn't get the e-mail, they can call 03007900597 to give consent over the phone.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable fam-ily members and friends by preventing the spread of

The vaccine is free and most children have it up their nose (nasal spray) which is quick and painless. The nasal spray is the most effective vaccine for children. If you do not wish for your child to receive the spray due to it containing porcine gelatine and would prefer for them to have the injectable vaccine, please contact us on the number provided below.




