We have been supporting the Rotary Club for a number of years now as part of their on-going world wide campaign to totally end polio. Polio is a particular nasty disease that affects peoples brain's and spinal cord and can cause paralysis. Purple Pinkie gets its name from the immunisation programme, where the little finger is stained with a purple die to show that a child has received the

vaccination



(Polio does still exist, although polio cases have decreased by over 99% since 1988. from an estimated more than 350, 000 cases to 359 reported cases in 2014. This reduction is the result of the global effort to eradicate the disease. Today, only 2 countries in the world have never

stopped transmission of polio (Pakistan and Afghanistan).

A vaccination costs 50p, so for every pound we collected today as part of our non uniform day—two children will be able to receive

the vaccination. So far £323 has been handed in for today's non uniform day. I am aware that there are a few £1's owing, so please could parents make sure they drop their owing money in as soon as possible.

At the end of the day, the most overwhelming key to a child's success is the positive involvement of parents.

Bikeability Fix and Bikeability Learn to Ride

During the February half term, Cycle Colchester have teamed up with the <u>Colchester Travel Plan Club</u> and the <u>Safer Essex Roads Partnership (SERP)</u> to offer more courses to help you get (and stay) on your bike. Both courses will run on Thursday 18 February during the half term holiday at Thomas Lord Audley school in Monkwick.

Bikeability Fix is a 1.5 hour session for kids 8 years and older and adults to learn the basics of fixing their bike. The course includes how to:

- •Learn and name parts of a bike
- •Adjust saddle height (and knowing what height to set)
- •Repair punctures/change an inner tube
- Adjust their brakes
- •Learn how gears work
- •Understand when to get a qualified mechanic to fix their bike instead

Bikeability Learn to Ride sessions are for children or adults who are unable to cycle. This includes those struggling to master the skill, adults who have never learnt to cycle or children making the transition from cycling with stabilisers to cycling without. Each session is 1:1 and lasts 45 minutes.

The sessions are all provided FREE by SERPS, however there is a £5 charge per learner to cover the hire of the school.
