Practice Time

As I have mentioned before, I want your children to do their very best whilst they are at our school and achieve their very best. To do that, your parental support is absolutely vital in helping your children reach their full potential.

Class Teachers have been and will be continuing to set both times tables and spellings for your children to learn weekly. These are not randomly plucked from the air by the teachers but are the expectations from the National Curriculum

It is absolutely vital, that you as parents practice, both the spellings and the times tables with your children because the children will be having a weekly test in school.

If children don't get 80% in these tests, then we will use some of their lunchtime each day to enable the children to practise their learning of them.

All children have the potential to succeed and we must work together to unlock that potential. Being able to spell and apply multiplication facts are key elements of every child's learning.

I am almost begging you as parents to please spend 30minutes each day, practising with your children their reading, spellings and times tables. Thirty minutes is almost no time at all, to support your children and their education.

Growth Mindset

A few extra playground markings have appeared on both our sites this week. As well as a pirate island in the Foundation Stage and a grapheme pool at Abbey Field, both sites have had our Growth Mindset motifs installed.

Part of Growth Mindset is thinking positively about our capabilities rather than embedding negative vibes in our children. If we tell them that they will never be any good at something because we weren't any good at it as parents, then it's very hard for that child to motivate themselves in that subject.

School Dinners

I am especially proud of the school dinners and the incredible variety and options that children have when having school dinners at our school.

We do, though, need some help. Our Foundation and KS1 dinners are funded by the government based on children who have a free school meal regularly.

The majority of children do regularly have a school meal but about 20% of children don't. If those children could have a school dinner at least once a week (twice would be even better) then it means that we get full funding for our catering, which does make a significant difference in our catering budget. Friday, for some strange reason is a very popular day, and Wednesday is not far behind!

For children in KS2, the Governors of the school, have always been committed to keeping the costs as low as possible to support parents. £2.00 is not a lot for a school dinner and we are one of the cheapest schools in Colchester, with, in my humble opinion, some of the best quality. 
