During the visit, Their Majesties will also unveil the name of Colchester Zoo's newest addition, a baby white rhino.

The King and The Queen Consort will then visit Colchester Library to take afternoon tea with Age UK volunteers and service users and learn about the library's impact in the community through the Essex Year of Reading.
