Attendance

Please note that the responsibilities falling to schools with regards to attendance are changing, most specifically in Essex with regards to fixed penalty notices. As you will all be aware from the school's attendance policy, leave of absence will not be permitted in September unless a child has at least 97% attendance, this is up from 94% at the current time. In addition, a child will be classed as a Persistent Absentee if their attendance is less than 90%. Finally, fixed penalty notices can and will be issued to a child who is unauthorised absent from school for a period of 5 school days or more, this is a significant change from the 10 school days more currently stands at.

The governors and I are keen that we continue to work with and support leave of absence requests but please note attendance must be above 97%.

The message from the government and Essex is very clear. Attendance at school is important, it is a key life skill and a child's education suffers when they do not attend.
