As is per usual we also received a staffing and pupil update which includes forecasts for the future as well as the current situation. We received a very thorough finance update from our Business Manager and are happy that whilst the funding for schools is very tight we manage well with what we have allocated to us.

We have a very exciting update from Mrs Skinner about a new history club that will run from November 2nd to December 14th . The school has also appointed a group of History Ambassadors and some Working Group Historians who will be championing the One Square Mile Project and enthusiastically leading on all things history within the school. Our teachers also continue to be supported by local artist Nicola Burrell and we are looking forward to a school art/ history exhibition in the coming months.

We were pleased to hear that our School Council and Unicef Ambassadors are in place and that they are being active in putting their great ideas forward as to how we can improve things in the school from a pupil perspective.

St John's Abbey Gate

Did you Know?

- St John's Abbey, also called Colchester Abbey, was a Benedictine monastic institution in Colchester, Essex, founded in 1095.
- The only substantial remnant is the elaborate gatehouse, while the foundations of the abbey church were only rediscovered in 2010.
- The abbey suffered a disaster in its early years, when a large fire in 1133, which burned much of Colchester, severely
 affected the monastery.
- Following the Tudor victory in the Wars of the Roses King Henry VII appears to have viewed the abbey with suspicion, although he stayed there during his visit to Colchester. Catherine of Aragon also stayed at the abbey during her visit to the town in 1515. Following Henry VIII's divorce of Catherine, he began the Dissolution of the Monasteries in 1536.
- St John's was one of a handful of abbeys that refused to surrender to Henry VIII's Commissioners during the Suppression, succumbing only after the execution of the abbot for treason.
- The property was eventually acquired by the Lucas family who converted some of the abbey buildings into a house. It
 remained their family seat until the mid-17th century, but it suffered considerable damage as a Royalist stronghold during the siege of Colchester in 1648. The gatehouse itself was stormed by Parliamentary troops and their artillery damaged the vaulted roof and destroyed part of the upper storey.
- The site was used to house Dutch prisoners in the 1660s, after which the remaining abbey buildings appear to have been demolished; there are no references to occupation after the mid-18th century.
- The Abbey Gate is about 100 meters from the school's Town site.
