Reading—Please Read-Boom Reader

When I meet with new parents—one of the things I always say, is that as a school our expectation is that parents read to/listen to their children read at least 5 x a week.

This has never changed.

As a parent myself I have many failings, too numerous to mention, (Mrs Bullivant has just confirmed this with a nod). But at home there is the expectation that either my wife or I will listen to or read to our daughter before she goes to bed. This is engrained in our routine's at home.

Yes, it is a pain at times, especially when I can think of several other things to do—but she's my daughter and we invest in her. The best way to invest in her is with time.

It's very easy to blame the school for our own failings as parents—but could I humbly suggest that rather than criticise the school for asking your child to stay in at break to complete their reads. You actually just listen to them read and record

GoRead is now Boom Reader. This logs reading recorded from Saturday morning to Saturday morning.

In effect, for parents this means that if you squeeze a read in on Friday morning (to hit that magic 5 × reads), it will be counted. But if you read on Friday night and log it, it won't be counted until the next weeks totals.

So far the organisation has planted—1,372,569 trees and has restored 508 acres.

 increasing biodiversity both on land and in the oceans,
- improving lives in the communities where we plant,
- raising environmental awareness in the classrooms, tackling climate change.
