

They help their patients get better by using care plans, doing tests and giving medicine to help people to become healthy again. People usually see nurses in doctors' surgeries by making appointments, but nurses also work in hospital wards and emergency departments. Nurses are very busy and do lots of

different jobs like give jabs, change bandages, check on the patients, clean cuts, take blood pressure, write notes and get people ready for operations. Nurses in hospitals can care for the same patients a lot - they talk with them and their families and so they get to know the patients very well.
