sources. Adults should make sure that the information you are getting is not harmful, and help you find and understand the infor-

mation you need.

Head Lice Please could I ask all parents to have a route through their children's hair over the weekend in a search for head lice.

We have had several instances recently, especially in Year 3/4 where they have taken up temporary residence.

There is I'm afraid no simple solution for this other than regularly checking hair—and if you see your child scratching—diving in.

According to the NHS the first point of action should be Wet

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you: wash hair with ordinary shampoo

apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)

comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

Please do check your children's hair, it's really important that al parents get involved. Up to 12 million children get head lice every year and we have had them in our house several times!



## Resilience Rex (Keep going even when it's hard; never give up)

Adversity is a fact of life. Resilience is that ineffable quality that allows people to be knocked down by life and come back at least as strong as before. Rather than letting difficulties or failure overcome them and drain their resolve.

Psychologists have identified some of the factors that make a person resilient, among them a positive attitude, optimism, the ability to regulate emotions, and the ability to see failure as a form of helpful feedback.

At school we use the acronym FAIL—First Attempt In Learning. If you fail, don't give up—because the end is not the END. In fact 'END' neans Effort Never Dies. This can followed in the children's learning by NO, which is not that the answer is not right but the Next Opportunity.

Resilience is a really important life skill—which is why it is an integral part of our Learning Dispositions.

To not give up, to keep trying and to constantly do our best are key factors that will help our chil-dren succeed.
