Greater Depth Punctuate a sentence using an apostrophe for possession with singular and proper nouns that can end in s, using a variety of sentence types containing conjunctions.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain if an apostrophe for possession has been used correctly in a sentence with singular nouns that do not end in s. Using CVC, CCVC and CVCC words and high frequency words.

Expected Explain if an apostrophe for possession has been used correctly in a sentence, using singular and proper nouns, including words that can end in s.

Greater Depth Explain if an apostrophe for possession has been used correctly in a sentence with singular and proper nouns that can end in s, using a variety of sentence types containing conjunctions.
