- Sometimes a parenthesis is in italics, sometimes it is in (brackets), sometimes there is a dash – and sometimes it has 'inverted commas' ground it.
- Parentheses are used to:
- Explain what a difficult word means.
- Show someone's thoughts
- Add extra information to help the reader
- Emphasise a point
- Can you use brackets to add extra information?
- E.g. His shell (being completely covered in grass) made for a comfortable home.
