Safer Internet Day

Next Tuesday is the global 'Safer Internet Day' which runs with the theme—<u>'Together</u> <u>for a Better Internet!'</u>

The day focuses around using technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively.

Everyone has their part to play in making the internet a better place—and that does include all our parents.

As a school, we spend a lot of time dealing with issues that have arisen from inappropriate use of the internet by both children and parents. We constantly reiterate with our children a few maxims.

- 1, Don't write or post anything on-line that is negative, rude or unkind—once it is posted, you can't undo it and even if you subsequently delete what you have written, there is a very high chance that it will have already have been forwarded or a screenshot taken.
- 2, Don't write or post anything that you don't want anybody else to know. This is especially relevant for facebook users. Once you have posted it, it is out there and you have no control over who else will be able to access that information, however high you've set your privacy settings.

Our top tips for parents and this does include myself, with an 11 year old—going on 18

- 1. Limit their time on their phones and only allow them to use their phones downstairs. Remember as parents our job is to parent, not to be their friend.
- 2, Check their phones and what they've written. I have yet to come across a perfect child, my own most definitely included in that! It is vital that you know what your child is writing and looking at on the internet.
- 3, No phones in the bedroom, whatever creative excuse they come up with. The best reasons my son has come up with were—I need an alarm, so we bought him an alarm clock for about £5.00 and I need a torch to read to which we pointed out the light switch!

My best advice is to please, park sensibly and respectfully. Be patient. Remember that being 5 minutes late is better than hitting a child with your car or worse still killing them.


And Finally,
