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Boxford Farm



Class Dutch visited Boxford Farm yesterday. On this particular farm, they grow mostly soft fruit and veg (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, asparaaus. rhubarb).

The children learned about the irrigation system for the strawberry plants in the glass houses and about mixing nutrients to put into the soil for optimum growth.

They were also shown live pests and insect control as well as the bumblebees they use for pollinators. It was very interesting to see how they can order live insects in specially to control other insect pests that would ruin the crop. For example; a spider mite can ruin the crop so they bring in red mites to eat the spider mites. Aphids and white fly can also ruin the crop so they showed us other insects and devices they have to control these pests. They try not to use chemicals to spray their crop where possible.

The biggest treat was being let loose on 3 rows of strawberries and being able to pick our own punnet—I hope they left a few strawberries for classes Iceni and Paxman!


Newsletter (Mr Men/Little Miss) Challenge
