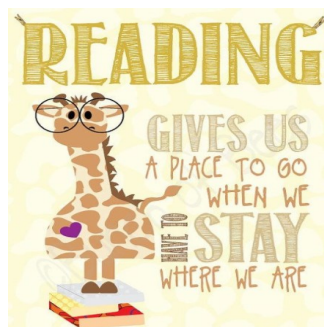
Snow Fun!

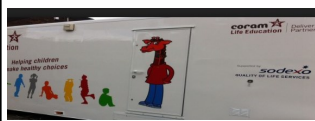
Reading

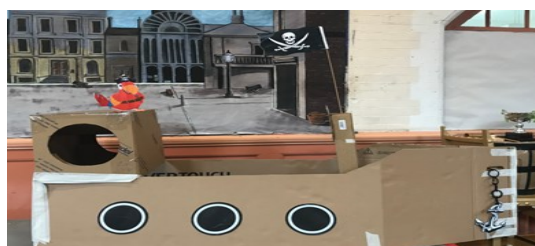
