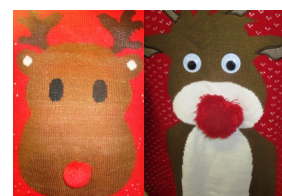
The winning entry each week from each phase will get to choose a free book or writing prize.

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of a Child (UNCRC).

This term we have been discussing these articles from the UN Convention...

Article 29: Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities. It should also help you learn to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.

Article 12: You have the right to give your opinion, and for adults to listen and take it seriously.

Article 14: You have the right to choose your own religion and beliefs. Your parents should help you decide what is right and wrong, and what is best for you.

Article 3: All adults should do what is best for you. When adults make decisions, they should think about how their decisions will affect children.

Article 30: You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right.
