School Meal Arrears

The school often finds itself between a rock and a hard place when it comes to school meals. You wouldn't expect to go to a restaurant or McDonalds and just walk out without paying for the food. Yet we often find that when it comes to meals for their children at school, parents are often remiss when it comes to paying or dare I say in some cases—just don't pay at all.

At the moment, the school office are having to spend a considerable amount of time chasing parents for school meal payments.

I do not ever want to be in the situation where we have to deny a child lunch because a parent has made the decision to repeatedly not pay for school meals—but at the same time, the school budget cannot sustain non payment for school meals. Nor is it right or fair.

Please could I remind parents that school meals should be paid for in advance.

Going forward if parents do not keep up to date with payments for school meals then the school will have take the decision to not provide a meal for that child—which will mean that parents will have to bring a packed lunch into school for their child until the debt is settled.

Year 6 parents, in particular, please be mindful of the above as we cannot have children leaving us where there is still a parental debt against the child's name.

We had a near miss this morning before the start of school when a car had to perform an emergency stop to avoid hitting a child. Fortunately this was a near miss and the child was unharmed. A number of weeks ago we had a parent drive into the back of another car. Both of these events were avoidable and I worry that it is only a matter of time before someone gets killed. I must impress upon parents that when driving—drive with full care and attention and do not speed—a child's life is a transit that the start that the start of the st life is not worth it. I would also ask parents to remind their children that are walking—that you stop at roads and check before you cross — you do not cross in the hope that cars will stop. This must work both ways.
