We couldn't be

prouder of the effort, enthusiasm and commitment they have demonstrated every day and with such a positive outlook.

My thanks to all our Year 6 parents for helping get them primed and ready but most importantly to the children—a huge well done and a long wait now until mid July when the results come back.

There is a lot of argument on both the positive and negative impact of the Year 6 SATs and what SATs are actually testing: the child or the school.

Regrettably, there is no easy answer, because SATs are a part of our education system. I would though say this—the knowledge and information that the children are taught and apply in these tests far outstrips anything we were ever taught or had to apply at their age.

Testing and exams, the pressure of an interview, winning and losing are all part of life and if the SATs and the knowledge and information that they imbue, help in some way to prepare the children both for secondary school and as a skill for later life, then the SATs, the school, you as parents and the children themselves have all contributed to that. Life is all about Life Chances and our Year 6 children have proved what they are all very capable of achieving, regardless of what their actual results are. So 'Well Done' Year 6.
