Not being able to see friends and do the things we normally do is hard for all of us—but then everyone's in the same boat and that does help a bit.

Following the outbreak of corona-virus, Governors are continuing with business as usual to ensure that the school is kept running and has the necessary support for both pupils and staff. We are meeting regularly with the school's senior management team although this is now being done remotely.

If you did not receive this e-mail or are still having difficulty, please contact the school.




