We will learn to use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined.

Reading

The children have daily DEAR time (drop everything and read) where they read in a group with an adult, answer comprehension questions and complete Book Bingo activities. The group, teacher read will be recorded onto Boom Reader at school.

All children should be reading 5x a week at home and this should be recorded on Boom Reader.

Geography

We will learn to describe and understand key aspects of physical geography with a focus on mountains and volcanoes.

Design and Technology

We will be working with local artist, Nicola Burrell, to create card structures of local landmarks as part of the One Square Mile project.

Mathematics

mathematical reasoning and knowledge of mathematical vocabulary through the following units of study:

Multiplication and Division

The focus will be multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by a single digit number with and without remainders. We will use equipment and partitioning to find the answers.

Measurement (length & perimeter)

We will measure, compare, add and subtract lengths (m/cm/mm) and learn to measure the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes.

Fractions

We will learn to compare, order, add, subtract and solve problems involving fractions.

Mass and Capacity

We will use scales to measure and compare mass in grams and kilograms. We will also use measuring cylinders to explore capacity in litres and millilitres. We will then compare capacity and volume.
