#### <u>Awards</u> Parking on Flagstaff Road

I have had several meetings over the last few weeks with both the Traffic Enforcement Team at Colchester and with Babcocks, who service and repair military vehicles and who are based on Flagstaff Road.

There is a significant concern about parking along Flagstaff Road about:

- 1. The size of the military vehicles that enter and leave the Babcock site
  - 2. Parking by the dentist surgery and opposite Abbey Gate house
    - 3. Parking in the cul-de-sac at the bottom of Flagstaff Road.

Since previous arrangements were put in place, the school has grown considerably with 390 children now in the school. The school, Traffic Enforcement and Babcocks is concerned that if the situation remains as it is then it is only a matter of time before we have a serious accident that involves a member of our school. None of us want that on our conscience!

With the above in mind, I need to inform you that the Traffic Enforcement Team will be stepping up their patrols in and around St John's Green from Monday of next week. The traffic regulations for double yellow lines along all of Flagstaff Road (from opposite the dentist surgery to Circular Road) will be strictly adhered to. This means that if you park there, even if you stay in your car, you are likely to get a ticket.

I fully appreciate the frustrations that will be born from this and wish I could offer an alternative parking solution. Unfortunately, I can't, other than to say that the decision taken by the school, in conjunction with the Traffic Enforcement Team and Babcocks, with regards to parking along Flagstaff Road, is about safeguarding children.

And Finally ...

Mrs Bullivant has been complaining to me for the best part of the week that she can't find her school camera. Twice I've been accused and twice had my desk drawers checked. Fortunately, and I don't like to gloat, the camera turned up yesterday-in Mrs Bullivants desk drawer...apparently it wasn't there when she last looked!
