Funding for Schools

I'm sure you are very aware of the fund-ing cuts that are facing all schools. St John's Green is no exception to the implications of reduced funding and most significantly the impact you'll see or notice is reduced support for class teachers by Learning Support Assistants.

'Funding For Schools' is a growing group of governors, parents and school staff from NE Essex who are campaigning for more realistic funding for schools and colleges across Essex. We have all seen big gaps between our schools' income and expenditure. This is having a devastating effect on our schools, ranging from staff redundancies, teachers paying for neces-sary equipment themselves, mothballing new classrooms and postponing mainte-nance of buildings.

We are doing a number of things to lobby the Government so they can set a realistic budget for schools this September.

Two local councils in Essex are due to discuss calls for fairer funding for schools over the next 2 weeks. Essex County Council is due to debate a motion at its full council meeting on Tuesday 9 July, while councillors at Colchester Borough Council will discuss schools budgets at a meeting of the whole council on Wednesday 17 July.

We want people to turn out to both meetings - at County Hall, Chelmsford at 9:30am on Tuesday and at Colchester Town Hall on Wednesday 17 July at 5.30pm. Bring placards and banners. Come and let the politicians know that education is important and should be properly funded. Our children are our future - by tipping schools into a funding crisis, the future for all of us is jeopardised.
