## Plastic Bag Sales Down in England by 90%

#### What is plastic pollution?

- Plastic pollution is a big problem because it is not biodegradable.
- Since people have been charged for single-use plastic carrier bags, they are buying fewer of them.

It seems that people are doing their bit to tackle plastic pollution. The government says that 490 million fewer single-use plastic bags were sold at supermarkets in England last year.

Since 2015, the biggest supermarkets have charged people 5p for a plastic carrier bag. This was to dissuade people from buying a bag.

Instead, they want people to reuse carrier bags. Government statistics say that the average person in England now just buys ten bags a year from one of the main supermarkets.

By contrast, in 2014, English people took 140 bags on average when they were often free. This is why the government thinks asking people to pay is a good idea.

Environmental secretary Theresa Villiers said that it shows the 5p charge "continues to deliver results".

The rules on whether you have to pay 5p for a bag are different depending on where you live in the UK. In England, only shops with more than 250 workers have to charge 5p. By contrast, in Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales, every shop has to charge 5p.

Plastic pollution is a big problem. Plastic isn't biodegradable. It can take hundreds of years to break down and can start to build up on huge landfills.

A lot of plastic ends up in the oceans, where animals can mistake it for food and eat it. Government scientists believe that 100,000



marine mammals and a million birds die annually this way from plastic waste.

The government is planning to take more action on plastic waste. It has also said that it wants to mostly ban plastic straws, stirrers and cotton buds from April 2020.

The government hopes that this will tackle the problem of plastic pollution. According to the government, the UK uses nearly 5 billion plastic straws and nearly 2 billion plastic cotton buds each year!
