Report to parents from the Full Governing Body meeting held on 24/01/2022

The Governing Body discussed the importance of supporting the school's reading strategy because it is a well established fact that the ability to read is such an important factor when we look at success (in it's many forms) in later life.

We discussed the on-going impact of Covid and how this has affected children's ability to access their education. Whilst this has been a significant challenge the school has managed the situation well given the difficult circumstances.

The Governors began the process of looking at the latest educational data which gives us an understanding of how all our year groups are doing in the areas of Reading, Writing and Maths. It also helps us understand what the on-going impact of the pandemic has been and what the school to support children that need additional support.

We received an update on staffing which is looking healthy although we are advertising for both Midday Assistants and Learning Support Assistants.

We heard from Governors who had attended a School Council/ UNICEF meeting; they reported being extremely impressed with the Council representatives who made excellent contributions to the meeting. We enjoyed reading the report from of the Year 6 representatives (you can read it overleaf).

Governors received a very comprehensive update on the school finances and we are very satisfied that these are in very good order.

We also discussed the very real concern of the rapidly rising cost of living increases. The school is committed to not allowing the increase in food costs to affect the price of our school meals. The catering team will continue to monitor the situation and to provide the children with a nutritious and balanced menu, while ensuring it is an affordable option for parents.

We heard that the PTA is looking for new members to join them and we would encourage parents to consider getting involved as this is a great way to support the school.
