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


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## World Book Day



Just a reminder to everyone that next Friday (4th March), we are celebrating World Book Day.

Class teachers will have a plethora of reading related activities planned so the day will look a little different to what it might do otherwise.

On this day, children and staff are welcome to come into school dressed as a Book Character. (Just to clarify, football kits are not really entering into the spirit of things when it comes to dressing up as book characters—not of course to be disparaging about football stories!) To add some encouragement and creativity to everything and to put the pressure on the judges, we will judge and reward the best dressed book characters in each class. There will also be a best book character for the Year Group and a final prize for the best character in the phase—that is I appreciate a lot of judging! (I have my costume ready, not 100% sure whether I'll walk between sites in it.)

There will be no PE this day with the exception of after school clubs. For children doing after school clubs, they should bring their club clothes to school in a separate bag and class teachers will facilitate somewhere for them to change at the end of the day.

## Coronavirus Update

Obviously we're entering a brave new world as far as Coronavirus is concerned and the school has received some new advice.

There is a separate letter from Essex County Council that will be sent out by e-mail with the newsletter today. The letter goes into more detail with regards to the following:

- The government has removed the legal duty to Self isolate following a positive test.
- Anyone testing positive is still advised to stay at home and Self isolate for at least 5 days.
  - Routine contact tracing will end
  - Attendance at school is mandatory

As from Monday 28th February, all Covid cases will be authorised if we get evidence of the positive LFT from parents and will be recorded as 'authorised illness' for child's attendance records. We will authorise positive LFTs same as we would for a cold/flu/chicken pox, etc. This will no longer be entered separately and as such, means that because it is being entered as 'illness', it will affect the children's attendance record.

We will continue to notify parents by e-mail if we get a positive case in a class.
