Children will be taken out by some of our class teachers for a story towards the end, so parents can enjoy a few minutes of adult only conversation.

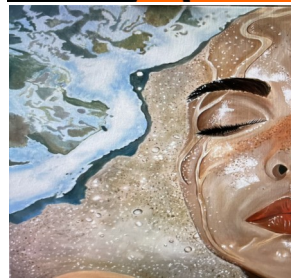
It would, of course, be great to see as many of you there as possible.
