
MEDICATION IN SCHOOL
We have recently reviewed our approach
to administering medication (antibiotics)
at our two sites. From Monday 4th February the following revised guidelines will
apply for all parents.
For any medicines where administration is
for 3x a day, this should be happening
before and after school and there is no
need for the school to be involved.
First dose - a.m. before school.
Second dose - b.m. straight after

Second dose - p.m. straight after

school.
Third dose - p.m. before bed. Parents will appreciate that the advice on prescriptions recommends the amount of doses, it does not normally recommend the times

This is obviously not always the case, and sometimes medications do need to be administered at more specific times.
Parents will still need to complete and sign
the medication consent form for the
school to administer medication but the school to administer medication but the expectation will be that the medicine is collected each day from the school office. The school will no longer accept decanted bottles, which some parents have in the past done. Parents will then need to return the medication the next day, although they will not need to complete the consent form again.

### FIZZ FREE FEBRUARY

Fizz Free February is coming to Colchester for the first time, will your family #gofizzfree? Friday 1st February marks the start of Fizz Free February meaning it's time to ditch sugary

drinks for 28 days.

Launched by Southwark Council in 2018, Fizz Free February is a great way to reduce your family's sugar intake by cutting out fizzy drinks. Through this campaign, Colchester Borough Council and livewell Colchester aim to raise awareness of the health implications of drinking fizzy drinks which often contain high amounts of sugar. Latest data Public Health England on the nation's diet shows that sugar now makes up 13.5% of 4 to 10 year-olds and 14.1% of teenagers daily calorie intake respectively, while the official recommendation is to limit sugar to no more than 5%.

To join in, encourage your pupils to pledge to give up fizzy drinks for 28-days and tweet us your progress using #gofizzfree. You can also take part by signing up on the website or just by going it alone!
