Lower Phase Reading


Well done! Last week was a more successful week for the Lower Phase reading, with all the classes getting 90% and over.

- certificates.



Last week saw another busy learning week in the Year 1 classes. In Numeracy the children were developing their knowledge of measuring the length of objects using a range of items including bricks, feet and hands. The children started the week by rehearsing how to accurately measure the length of an object and how to record their observations. As

the week progressed, and their measuring skills developed, they started estimating the length of items and then measuring them to check their answers.

In Literacy the children used 'Mog and the Christmas Calamity' as a stimulus to support

their skills of retelling of a story. Once they had watched and listened to the story, they created freeze frame pictures of events in the story so they could create their own story map. This in turn supported the children's oral retelling of the story and next week it will be used as starting point to adapt the story so they can write their own version





Learning in the Foundation Classes

In the Foundation classes bridge making was used as a way to develop the children's understanding of space and shape. In talk partners they were set a challenge to create a bridge using a range of resources including; wooden bricks, Duplo, recycled materials and newspaper. The children were very crea-

tive with their ideas and produced some fantastic structures. They were then asked to share with the class how they had made their bridges and answer questions set by their peers, which supported their speaking and listening skills. When the children were outside they moved the learning forward by introducing the story of the 'Three Billy Goats Gruff' to their play. There were some brilliant bridges and very

scary trolls hiding underneath them.

Last week, amidst much excitement, our new water feature was installed. This apparatus is made up of different levels and will have a constant flow of water running into the mud digging area. It was very popular with the children who sent plastic ducks down the levels, made dams, played in the water and digging in the mud.
