Arts Day

This Wednesday was a whole school 'Arts Day' and the children in every year group put their artistic and creative talents to the fore.

Each Year Group had a different focus dependent on their current curriculum.

Year 3's art was linked to their history on ancient Greece with the children designing and creating vases using water colour wash and pens to recreate Greek myths and patterns on vases.

Year 6 studied local artist 'Sally Howard' and sketched some of her work. In literacy, they are studying the book 'Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen and they also created a collage and print of key elements of the story.

Our EYFS children were creating life cycles of butterflies onto paper plates using different types of pasta whilst in Year 1, the children were experimenting with mixing and tinting colours using 'Paul Klees' work.

Year 4 and Year 5 both focussed on Islamic art—with Year 5 focusing on their use of pattern and tessellation as well as creating their own printing blocks. Year 4 concentrated on geometry and designed plates.







Finally, Year 2 looked at work by William Morris and were using printing and rolling using bubble wrap to create pictures of flowers.
