Maths—Bar Modelling

Fundamentally the concepts we teach don't change but as we learn more about the ways children learn, through research, the ways we teach them do.

Maths is a prime example of this as numbers will always be numbers. However the way we teach the concepts has developed and changed.

Bar models are pictorial representations of problems or concepts that can be used for any of the operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. In word problems, bar models hold the huge benefit of helping children decide which operations to use or visualise problems.

Teaching staff have all been trained in using Bar Modelling and the skill of using it is becoming more fundamental in our teaching of maths.

A long pre-amble I know—but our newsletter challenges this half term will all be based on bar modelling.
