Coronavirus

One of the e-mails that we were asked to forward this week, was less than helpful, so I thought it might be useful to clarify as it currently stands.

- Schools have been asked to keep their channels of communication open with parents over the Christmas Break. In short this means that if one of the children test positive for Coronavirus going forward it is important that you let us know by e-mail at admin@st-
- johnsgreen.essex.sch.uk (please include in this information, the child's name and their class, when their symptoms started as well as an image of the confirmation text from Track and Trace).
- The school will then contact PHE through Essex CC and if necessary notify other parents that there has been a positive case and that families must Self Isolate.
- The requirement for Self Isolation is currently 10 days but the amount of time families are asked to Self Isolate for does vary depending on the time gap between the onset of symptoms and the positive test.
- If we do need to contact parents we will notify you by text and e-mail.
- If you have not heard from the school by Christmas Eve, you can breathe a sigh of relief. This is because any positive test confirmed after this date is deemed not to affect the class bubble but only the family (and any contacts they have had).

If any family has a positive test after Christmas, please notify us by email including the date of when your Self Isolation comes to an end.

Hopefully, for the immediate future that clarifies everything, however trying to keep up with the news at the moment is an impossible task and the Government seem to be making random decisions all over the place.

At the present time, our understanding is that Primary Schools will return as stated (for us on the 5th January) for all children. If that changes over the next few days, then we will notify you by text and email

However, please don't rely on the news for information. School's responses come after they have been advised by county, who are privy to more information than we are told on the news—this means that there could be a delay of a few days between a news item and schools contacting parents.

In short I'd say this, please try not to overthink or over worry about it. This will be a classic case of no news is good news as far as Self Isolation and school opening is concerned.

What I would also say is this. Have a very good Christmas and I wish you the very best for the New Year. See you in January.

The EYFS had a whole hot chocolate thing going on for


their journey up to the frozen North, whilst Year 1 and Year 2 were busy designing a new jumper for Arthur as well as some reindeer for his sleigh.
