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### RE Week

The focus of our RE week was the Hindu celebration of Diwali. The celebration focusses on the story of Rama and Sita and how Diya lamps were lit to show them the way home. 

- Resilience** - keep going even when it's hard; never give up


**This weeks Challenge has been set by Jack Savage in Year 4.**

### Children's University

As a school, we are actively involved with the Children's University programme. The Children's University is a registered charity, whereby every child from the ages of 7 -14 years old (and 5 and 6 year olds with their families) can study. Children receive a 'Passport to Learning' and they are celebrated and rewarded for their learning achievements outside of the normal school day. The children gain stamps in their personal passports from the learning destinations (clubs, visits to educational places, etc.) and they then attend a graduation after they have achieved certain numbers of learning hours.
