Learning Disposition

Motivating Melinda—Be keen to
Succeed; Try your Best.

Motivation is the motor that
moves our world. You may often
hear about a lack of motivation at
school or at work, where children
have difficulty studying, learning
at home, staying focused, or
getting work done, but the same children have no
problem learning all 300 Pokemon!

To help promote learning, it's important that we:

- Concentrate on the child's learning process and encourage and reward them for a working hard.
- Reward when it really matters, or else they won't see these kind of rewards as special, but rather commonplace and expected
- Avoid using negative labels, and instead talk about their strengths. Make sure they understand that just because they're not the best at one thing, doesn't mean that they're a failure, it just means that they have other strengths
