<ul> <li>This term, the children will be focussing on a few texts. We will read; Street Child, Escaping the Giant Wave, Kid's Fight Plastic and The Boy Who Made the World Disappear.</li> <li>In Street Child the children will be focussing on a few different text types. They will write; diary entries, instructions/recipe and a persuasive piece on schooling. They will be writing a persuasive text based on 'Kids Fight Plastic' which highlights the importance of looking after our oceans.</li> <li>In Escaping the Giant Wave and the Boy Who Made the World Disappear they will also cover a range on text types.</li> <li>In reading, we will focus on discussing text that we have shared together and developing our understanding on</li> </ul>	The children will learn place value in 4 digit numbers. They will also be learning about addition and subtrac- tion using 3 and 4 digit numbers. This includes formal written methods and identifying the most efficient mathematical method. Children will also be looking at length and perimeter of 2D shapes. Multiplication and division by single digit numbers. This includes the formal methods of short multiplication and division. Children will also need to become fluent in their times tables up to 12 x 12. We will also be looking at 2D shape, angles and lines of symmetry.	In science we will be learning all about classification of living things. Children will identify, sort and group ani- mals into categories based on their features. In the second part of the term children will be looking at states of matter they will explore solids, liquids and gases looking at how and when these can change state . This includes looking at the water cycle and evaporation. <b>Physical Education (PE)</b> In P.E, children will be focussing on the skills of Ball skills, Football, Netball and Dance. This includes, accu- rately throwing, aiming before throwing, catching, defending and passing efficiently and sequencing moves to a rhythm.
