I share the frustrations that we are all feeling about the lockdown and the lack of clarity as far as schools and re-opening is concerned.

As a parent, I am very aware that my children are signifi-cantly missing out on the quality and diversity of education that we can give them at home and both my wife and I are teach-

I am also very aware that they are missing their friends and the social interaction that school provides.

As a Headteacher, I am keen to move on and welcome as many children back into school as I am able to.

However, my hands in many ways are tied. I have a number of teaching and support staff who must continue to self isolate. We're also beholden to the fact that we must provide (quite rightly) for our Key Worker and vulnerable children, in what will be class bases of no more than 15 children.

It's also important that we continue with the Home Learn-ing and support calls to the children in these times.

By welcoming back our Year 1 and EYFS children, as well as continuing to provide for the Key Worker and vulnerable children, I have reached capaci-ty for the school staff and have no wriggle room left and this education will look very different from what we are all used to.

I would dearly love to welcome back all our children but at the current time—we are where we are and as I said at the start—I very much share your frustrations.

What we can and must do is psychologically prepare our-selves and our children for coming back to school as, unless a miracle cure presents itself, we will be moving back towards a sense of normality whilst Coronavirus is still very much present in our society.

We can't be cowed by it, but we must be aware of it and act and behave accordingly.

Not long left now if you were think-ing of entering the 'Multi Schools Council Talent Show.'


