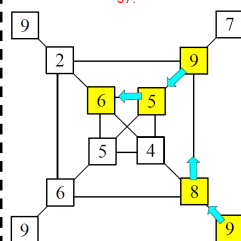

And Finally...

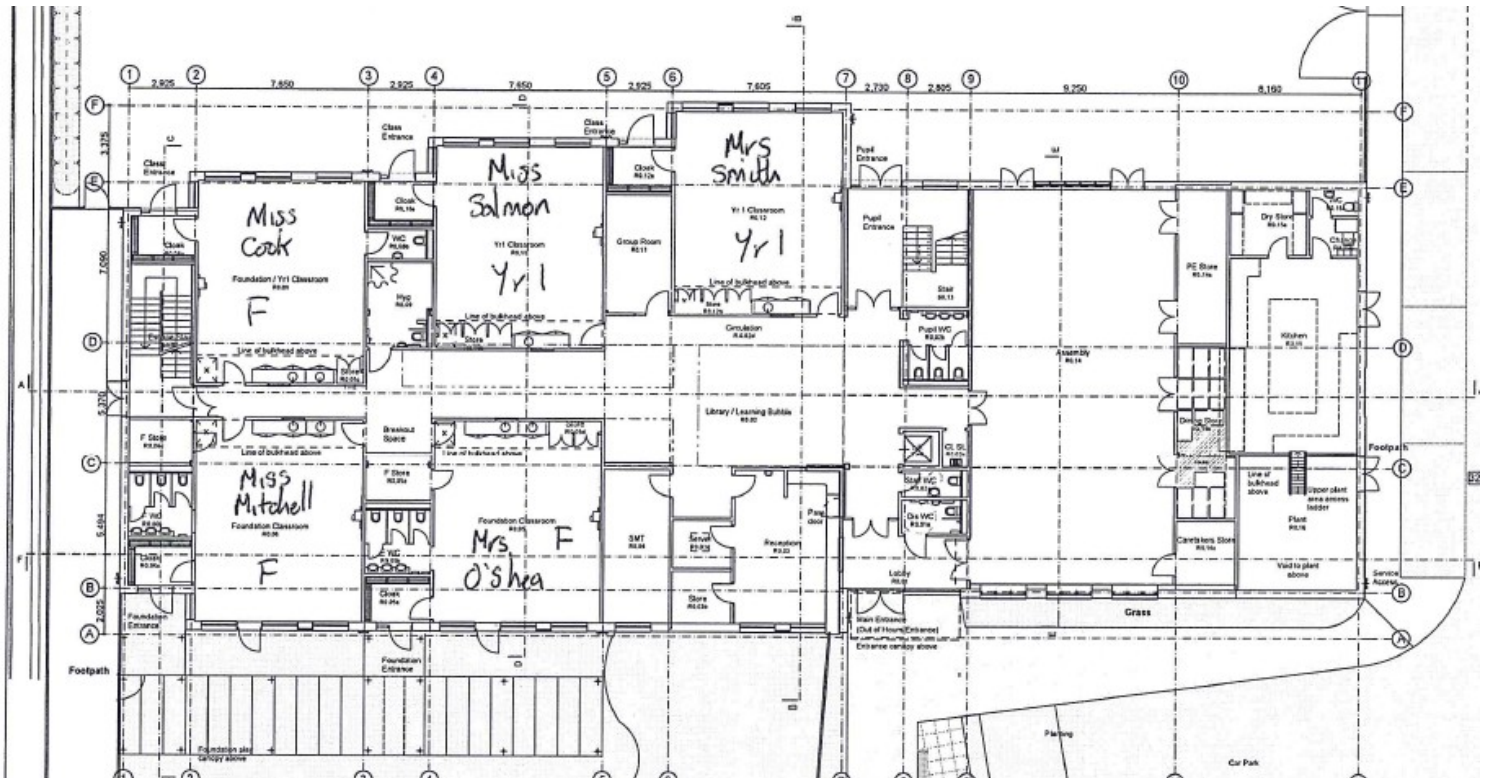
